Give an overview of what the punishment entailed, why it would have been used, and why you think it will have been effective at deterring future crime.</p>
<p>Maths/Problem Solving</p> 	<p>Create a timeline showing different types of punishment for the crime of theft.</p>	<p>Use a venn diagram to sort historic (old) crimes and modern (new) crimes. Which ones appear in both circles? For example, theft, murder...</p>	
<p>Art and Design</p> 	<p>Create a 'spot the difference' picture for a medieval trial and a modern one.</p>	<p>Use images or drawings to show how police uniform has changed over the years.</p>	<p>Make a 'Wanted' poster for a famous or fictional criminal, e.g, Dick Turpin, Voldemort, Moriarty... Don't forget to include their crimes and a reward.</p>
